

A brief history of Confirmation

In recent years, "confirmation" in the Lutheran Church has been reconsidered because it has grown to be something that it was never intended to be. This includes our circuit pastor's monthly meetings over the past several months with many reconsidering how we view such things. The many "traditions" of Lutheran confirmation all emerged in the last hundred years or so. Confirmation became the "rite of passage" for Lutheran fourteen year-olds by the 1940's. It was the most important moment of their young faith life with the emphasis placed on their confirmation vow. Sadly, a "graduation" mentality arose and many newly confirmed members drifted away soon after their vows because they believed they had "completed" their instruction. For the past 15-20 years, many in the LCMS have reevaluated in our best practices to teach children about Jesus.

This is not to say there was no merit in Lutheran confirmation all those years. Indeed, many children, including our own members, were taught the faith in Jesus in their confirmation instruction. However, with every church practice there comes a time for reconsideration and possible renewal.

Confirmation in the Early Church In the Early Church

"Confirmation" did not exist as we understand it today. Confirmation was actually a part of the rite of Baptism. Generally speaking, adult confirmands would undergo an extensive period of catechesis (typically three years), and then at the Easter Vigil would be baptized. They were then "confirmed" in this baptismal faith by means of chrism, prayers, the sign of the cross, and the laying on of hands. As Christianity became more widespread, confirmation went away as most were baptized as infants.

Confirmation in the Middle Ages

By the 12th century men such as Hugo of St. Victor there was a resurgence in confirmation, calling it a sacrament. Other medieval theologians followed suit. In November of 1439 at the Council of Florence, confirmation was designated a sacrament through the papal decree Pro Armenis of Eugene IV. It was from that time forward a part of the Roman sacramental system, bestowed grace, was equal in power to the other sacraments.

Confirmation in the Reformation Period

The Roman abuses of Confirmation had made Confirmation suspect in the minds of many, particularly Luther himself. Luther at different times called Confirmation: monkey business (Affenspiel), fanciful deception (Lügenstand), and mumbo-jumbo (Gaukelwerk). Luther's objections to the Roman Rite of Confirmation included: 1) It lacked the command and promise of the Lord. 2) It had no Scriptural basis.

The Lutheran Confessions followed a similar lead on confirmation. The Augsburg Confession, for instance, did not include confirmation among the sacraments. We can also find in the Apology to the Augsburg Confession the following: Confirmation and extreme unction are rites received from the Fathers which even the church does not require as necessary for salvation since they do not have the command of God. Hence it is useful to distinguish these from the earlier ones which have an express command from God and a clear promise of grace.

Apology of the Augsburg Confession XIII, Tappert, p. 21 Pietism (18th century)

Pietism is the anti-orthodox movement which began in the mid-17th century. It is most commonly known for it's emphasis on a heart-felt piety, the practice of piety, separation from the unconverted, and the unity of likeminded believers. We find under Pietism a shift began to take place in confirmation. With the rise of Pietism under Jacob Philip Spener (1635-1705) we find confirmation coming to the forefront, but with a different purpose than had ever existed. For the first time confirmation thus served: To demonstrate that the confirmand was truly converted. This resulted in the age for catechumens to go up. The age under Pietism, thus, became 16 years old.

Confirmation Comes to the United States

With the Lutheran immigrants coming to the United States in the 19th century, this hodgepodge of rites, practices, and theories behind confirmation all came over on the boats. By the 1940's the age was shifted younger toward what was traditional but not as young as was traditionally done, to 12-14 years old and with the rise of Lutheran Schools that exist up to 8th grade, grade level became more the measure. It was with this, that the graduation ceremony arose as there was an element to receiving communion. While not getting rid of instruction, there has been much discussion in our circuit, as there has been a shift over the last 15-20 years in many parts of the country to distinguish confirmation from First Communion. Our current hymnal does so as well. This is a more historic practice.

Having seen and done this at previous congregations, and with others that do the same, this serves to actually highlights and elevates both the importance of communion in one's life as well as the importance of continued, ongoing instruction. DCE Susie and I will be meeting with parents soon to discuss more of what this might look like, as well as with our Board of Education. We welcome questions and discussion so that we may best serve our youth and families in ways that line with the Reformation "solas" of: by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, with Scripture alone, so that glory goes to God alone.

Sr. SPY Youth Group


Wednesday February 7, 14, & 28 ~ 7-8:30 PM

During Youth Group on February 7, we will begin the process of assembling the Super Bowl Subs. There will still be a Bible Study and fellowship time as well!




