

What If...?

'But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.' 1 Corinthians 15:20

Dear friends in Christ, what if it didn't happen? What if there were no resurrection? What if Jesus didn't rise from the dead on the first Easter? What would that be like? What would life look like? In 1 Corinthians 15. St. Paul wrote that, 'if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished.' According to Paul, our faith would be futile and we would remain in our sins. He went on: 'If in this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.' We would be pitiable. Apart from the resurrection of Jesus – body and all – that first Easter Sunday, would there be any Christians? What would we be?

Indeed, it's hard to imagine a world not centered on Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. How would the years be numbered? Would Rome have fallen when it did? How long ago would the new world have been discovered? Or, to think about it on a more personal level, what would we believe and how would we live according to that faith, or lack of faith? I imagine we would probably begin by not going to church, and then...

If Christ had not been raised, parents wouldn't bring children for baptism, nor would they bring their children to Sunday School or tConfirmation instruction. If Christ had not been raised, what is the point of a marriage ceremony over any other contract. Indeed, every aspect of the human life and body would fall under the authority of the every individual.

We could certainly go on, but that would be a truly pitiable existence. Thanks be to God, however, that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and lives and reigns eternally. Because he is alive, our whole life has meaning. Baptized into his name, we are a new people. In this life and world, we are tempted in every way and at all times to believe it isn't true that Christ has been raised and lives. We are tempted in every way and at all times to live as if Christ had not been raised. Lord, have mercy on all of us!

How many of us find ourselves fighting against these temptations? Where can we turn? Where can we go?

To Christ! He is your Savior who forgives you when you are tempted and forgives you when you have given into temptation. Repent of sin and believe that Christ is risen from the dead for you!

There is no time like the present to refocus and refresh your faith and life in Christ's resurrection from the dead. It is as Paul said so stridently and joyfully to his beloved Corinthians: 'But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.' Christ is risen, Alleluia! He is risen from the dead and as the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep, his resurrection is simply the first of the rest to follow, including yours. You, yes YOU, are his chosen, his beloved. He will raise you, too, unto life everlasting! See you at church!



BOARD MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church, Pipestone MN February 20, 2023

Board Meeting Called to order by President Blake

Opening Prayer by Pastor

Approval of December meeting minutes. Motion to approve minutes by Doug Stotz, and carried by Loren Dockter.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Need to switch insurance on new rental property to church insurance policy. First payment came out of the account to make a payment to Lutheran Extension fund.

<u>Board of Elders:</u> No report. Update from Pastor that Rodger Smidt is a new Elder, and that T.J DeGroot is head elder at this time. Blake made a motion to appoint Tom Bobendrier to the vacant Elders position.

<u>Church Growth and Fellowship Committee:</u> Dalle family donations from our church were delivered to the family. The Committee plans to serve a Lent meal. Working on gifts of love.

Education Committee: Susie and Pastor working on confirmation and some changes to come. Looking at moving Confirmation to Wednesdays, staring next year, and doing every other week. Planning for confirmation to be a four year curriculum going forward. Looking into a new course book. Pastor did share this information with Pastor Petrich, regarding these changes. Susie is looking into a different JAM curriculum for next year.

Property Committee Loren got the old lightbulbs taken out to recycling. Our Janitor Kris's office lights were replaced. All rooftop filters have been replaced. The north entrance door stop was replaced. Loren reports that water fountain on the second level is having issues, and tiles under the fountain have stains. The plan is to take the water fountain out. Loren will make some calls, and look into ways to remove the stain from the floor tiles. Loren reports the north entrance door does not close on its own and plans to look at this tomorrow. He reports the south entrance door the panic bar quit, and Ole looked at it, and was not able to fix it. New parts were ordered for this. Parts will take 2-4 weeks to get in. Loren reports the front hand rail on the front steps has not been fixed, and this will be looked into. Loren reports complaints of the heat on the second level, going into church. Discussion of putting a fan unit in. Loren will discuss this with Corey Popma. Doug reports another Culligan bill has been paid, and discussion about the need of the water

softener, or turning the cycle dial down. Loren and a couple others are planning for tomorrow, to remove the double oven from the basement.

<u>Preschool Board:</u> They had their Valentines Party. Pastor reports the pancake breakfast fundraiser had a good turn out. The Board is planning to serve breakfast for one of the lent meals.

<u>Pastor:</u> Susie and Pastor have a conference in Arizona this coming weekend. Pastor talked about the agenda of the conference. Had one funeral this last month. Pastor Schiller will do tomorrow nights Lent service, in Pastor Amens absence. Tami Nelson will plan to fill in as church secretary, with Alissa leaving. Tami's hours are not determined at this time, but will be flexible. Tomorrow is Alissa's last day in the office. Lent services will begin.

Old Business: Rental house had a walk through with elders, and a few church members, to come up with a game plan for the house, and what repairs would be needed to be able to rent out the property. Plans for flooring, painting, and other repairs as discussed at the special voters meeting. Hopes to rent out the property by May. Discussion of the deed for the rental property getting switched over.

New Business: Pastor discussed some possible insurance changes, with his wife Becky accepting a new position. Pastor discussed some different plan options he has looked into, for him and his family. A proposal was made by Pastor to check more into the different insurance options, and review these plan options more in detail, with Doug Stotz, to determine what would work best financially. Verdeen Colbeck made a motion to move forward with this proposal by Pastor. Carried by Loren Dockter.
